



CONFLICT MINERALS STATEMENT

Atlantic Precision Engineering is concerned that the trade of conflict minerals mined in the eastern provinces of the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) may be fueling human rights atrocities in the region. These minerals and their refined metals—tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold (3TG)—are widely used in the end markets served by Atlantic Precision Engineering. Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, adopted in 2010, requires companies to report on the use of conflict minerals originating from the DRC and its neighbouring countries

Atlantic Precision condemns all activities in the raw material sector where human rights are exploited or abused and we support the actions of all governments and organisations to increase supply chain transparency and enable companies to source conflict-free minerals.

Atlantic Precision is committed to sourcing materials from companies that share our values around human rights, ethics and environmental responsibility. We expect our suppliers to comply with our Code of Conduct and meet our sustainability expectations, including Conflict Free sourcing.
